Stained Glass Windows

The Resurrection Windows, showing Easter lilies in stained glass, will be installed in the half-round window spaces at the rear of the nave. The installation will take place during Holy Week, and the windows will be dedicated on Easter Sunday.

The window project has been anonymously underwritten. Anyone wishing to dedicate a window to a loved one, in memory or in honor, may donate \$600 per window to New Life. Two windows are already so designated, and two more are available. Deadline for the Easter Sunday dedication is Sunday, May 24.

Stained glass artist Wendy Warren from Studio Arts and Glass designed the windows.

Episcopal Minute: St Joseph

Yes, we all have our minds on St. Patrick this week, and we will celebrate him three times this Sunday (Celtic Eucharist in the morning, St Patrick coffee hour afterwards, and Taize honoring St Patrick in the evening), acknowledging that yes, he is a minor saint, but not minor to the Irish!

However, two days later, March 19, **is** a major feast day, namely Saint Joseph (and this is one that you can legitimately claim as one of those "relax" days from your discipline). Saint Joseph is celebrated Tuesday, March 19, and our Wednesday morning liturgy will honor him, as well. Joseph had lots of dreams when he was continually warned about dangers to his small family. All these stories are from the Gospel of Matthew, and Matthew modeled his gospel of Jesus on Moses. So, it makes sense that he writes about Joseph having dreams – remember Joseph the dreamer in the book of Genesis? I think there is a connection!
