Taize services 2nd Sundays

The beautiful candle-lit worship services in the manner of Taize are held on second Sundays at 7 pm, led by Bo lole with musical accompaniment by Adam Keeler, classical guitar. The next service will be May 12, Mother's Day.

The Taize Community is located in southern France and is entirely ecumenical. All the music is in the form of meditative chants, many in Latin as a common language. Brother Roger of the community states, "From the depths of the human condition, a secret aspiration rises up. Caught in the anonymous rhythms of schedules and timetables, men and women of today are implicitly thirsting for an essential reality, for an inner life. Nothing is more conducive to a communion with the living God than a meditative common prayer with, as its high point, singing that never ends and that continues in the silence of one's heart when one is along again."

Bill Kendrick this Sunday

Bill Kendrick, long-time organist at St. Paul's Canton, is retired but likes to keep his hands in the Episcopal liturgy. We are honored to have him as our organist this Sunday. He will also play on July 7 and August 11.

Episcopal Minute: St George

Saint George's feast day is April 23, but you won't find him listed in our book of saints, *Lesser Feasts and Fasts*. Our book changes often (about every three years, when General Convention meets), but I don't think Saint George ever made the cut. Perhaps we found that dragon story a bit off-putting. Maybe the stories about him sound a little too miraculous.

The English, however, are very fond of Saint George, and invoke him now and then (memorably, in Shakespeare's <u>Henry V</u>, when Henry gave an inspiring speech to his troops ending with, "God for Harry, England, and Saint George!" Very stirring. In fact, Saint George is the patron saint of England, and his cross, looking rather like a mighty crusader cross, is red and formed in the traditional Roman cross shape. You may see this cross on the British flag, overlaid (or underlaid) by the diagonal cross of Saint Andrew, patron saint of Scotland.

So what's with the dragon? Surely a story to show braveness and valor. Occasionally one sees artwork of Saint George and the dragon, not to be confused with Saint Michael and Satan, who is often portrayed as a dragon too. How to tell them apart? Michael has wings.
