Episcopal Minute: Pentecost

Whitsunday, the old name for Pentecost, is now less frequently used. The terminology for our liturgical seasons underwent a major reshuffling in the 1960s in the wake of the Second Vatican Council, and some of our more arcane names disappeared (I do not mourn their disappearance - for instance, who can even pronounce Septuagesima? Which was the 70th day before Easter.) Back in earlier days, the Church of England called Pentecost by the name Whitsunday, and then came Trinity Sunday the following week, and all the Sundays thereafter were numbered as Sundays after Trinity. My 1928 prayer book follows this old pattern. But now, (since 1979) we number the Sundays after Pentecost beginning with Trinity Sunday as the first (this year, May 26), and the next Sunday is the second Sunday after Pentecost, and so on, until Advent. We tend to follow the Roman Catholic term for this six-month liturgical period and call it Ordinary Time. I tend to call the whole post-Pentecost period as Pentecost Season, which is probably not correct.

Adding to the confusion is the word Proper. Proper refers to the readings assigned for a given Sunday in Ordinary Time. This year, June 2 begins this period with Proper 4.

Our Propers for Ordinary Time this year will feature sequential Old Testament readings about King David. Last year we followed sequential readings about the Jewish ancestors Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, and Moses.

The Bookshelf: The Women

The Wednesday Book Group has been reading Kristin Hannah's historical novel The Women, which gives a wrenching description of experiences of army nurses in Vietnam. Following the life of Frankie, a young Californian nurse in 1967-1969, we readers see what Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) was like from the inside of her psyche. The story continues through relationship betrayals, addiction, a suicide attempt, and total mental collapse. Frankie and her nursing friends attend the dedication of the Vietnam memorial in Washington in 1982 and achieve the beginning of healing. It ends well.

The author has a long string of best-sellers (about 24) and writes very well. But be forewarned: the descriptions of surgical treatments in the field tents is not exactly MASH – no humor – lots of cringing. The bad treatment of Vietnam veterans in general is heartbreaking, and the ignoring of the 10,000 nurses who served is appalling. Ms. Hannah does much to right the record of their service.
