Episcopal Minute: D-Day 80th

Today is the 80th anniversary of the Allied Invasion of Europe, June 6, 1944, which turned the tide of World War II. It was very costly in terms of lives lost, and there is a huge cemetery at Normandy, France, to attest to this sacrifice to defeat the Axis Powers. Without this enormous effort, we might all be speaking German. It took the combined armies of the Allied powers to defeat Nazi Germany and thwart Hitler's maniacal reign. Germany surrendered almost a year later, and May 8, 1945, we celebrated the end of the war in Europe. The end of the war in the Pacific came on August 15, 1945, when the armistice was signed, and more formally, on September 2, Japan's final surrender. All of these anniversaries remind us of heroic service by our veterans.

On Memorial Day we prayed the Thanksgiving for Heroic Service: O Judge of the nations, we remember before you with grateful hearts the men and women of our country who in the day of decision ventured much for the liberties we now enjoy. Grant that we may not rest until all people of this land share the benefits of true freedom and gladly accept its disciplines. This we ask in the Name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (BCP p 839)
