# Tick your name, please

Each Sunday a member of the vestry oversees the morning gathering, and checks off names of attendees, listed on the podium at the door. This is a good way to track our attendance. In fact, we each used to do that ourselves.

Vestry requests that we resume our earlier habit, checking our own names before we enter the sanctuary. It's easy. The names are listed in alphabetical order, with dates for each Sunday.

### **Episcopal Minute: Peter & Paul**

On June 29 we will observe the joint feast day of Saints Peter and Paul. Hey, aren't they important enough each to have his own feast day? Definitely, and they do: On January 18 St. Peter has a major celebration of his own, The Confession of Saint Peter, celebrating his recognition and announcement of Jesus as the Messiah. And a week later, on January 25, St. Paul's dramatic turning point is celebrated with The Conversion of St. Paul. The two days, when the vestments are white, are bookend dates for the Week of Christian Unity.

But on June 29 we observe their martyrdom, and the vestments are red. Their martyrdoms are traditional observances. In both cases, we know that they died but we don't really know when or how. But tradition has both saints enduring execution in Rome under the Emperor Nero, so about the year 64. Both had made a huge impact on spreading the Good News in the 34 years since the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Tradition tells us that Peter was condemned to be crucified, but he requested that he be crucified headdown; he said that he was unworthy to be crucified in the same position as his Lord. Paul, being a citizen of Rome, was given a swifter death, execution by beheading. The day of June 29 was chosen for their death commemoration, an honor for many martyrs.
