Bill Kendrick returns

Bill Kendrick will return to our organ keyboard on two more Sundays this summer, July 7 and August 11. Bill has had a long career as parish musician and organist, and he held that position at St. Paul's Canton when Rev. Barbara was rector there. He and his wife Linda are now "snow birds," going to Florida over the winter, but when they are back in Canton, Bill regularly checks in with Rev. Barbara and offers his services. Aren't we lucky!

Although we have dropped the recessional hymn from our services this summer, we will resume them when Bill is here.

Episcopal Minute: General Convention

General Convention of the entire Episcopal Church USA is held every three years, and it is going on right now in Louisville KY. Every nine years, a Presiding Bishop is elected, and this year four male bishops were nominated to be our 28th Presiding Bishop. This seemed somewhat exclusionary, the nominee panel was challenged by petition, and now there is an additional candidate, a woman. Our current Presiding Bishop, the Most Rev. Michael Curry, will be stepping down this year. The Presiding Bishop is elected by the House of Bishops, and then the House of Deputies is asked to affirm their choice. Candidates are the Rt. Revs. Scott Barker (Nebraska), Daniel Gutierrez (Pennsylvania), Sean Rowe (NW Pennsylvania), Robert Wright (Atlanta) and DeDe Duncan-Probe (Central New York).

Each diocese sends eight deputies (four clergy, four lay) and has an equal number of alternates. Each diocese also sends its bishop or bishops. This will be Bishop Anne's first convention as a bishop.

There is a lot of business discussed, for instance, new candidates for inclusion (or, alas, deletion) in our saints' book, Lesser Feasts and Fasts.

In 2006, I attended General Convention as a visitor, since it was held nearby (in Columbus). The big issue that year was also about the election of a Presiding Bishop. First, there were four candidates (three men, one woman). Then, three more were added (all men). Famously, the winner was the woman: Katharine Jefferts-Shori. Several bishops thereafter decided to leave our church and join the Anglican Church in North America.
