Philadelphia Eleven film

The film about the Philadelphia Eleven will be available for streaming this weekend, and a ticket is required.

The Philadelphia Eleven were women deacons who were ordained in a service 50 years ago, July 29, 1974, in Philadelphia. The film about this momentous event lasts 1 ½ hours and may be streamed this weekend any time from 12 pm EST July 26 until 12 pm EST July 30. An \$11 ticket may be purchased from Kinema. Episcopal Minute: St James

The feast day of St James is today, July 25. It is fair to ask, Which St James? Just like all the saints named John, it is wise to specify which James we mean.

James could be the Brother of Our Lord. No, no that one. James could be James the Lesser, a minor player. No, that not one either. This James has an outsized role in the Gospels and in our day too.

James is the brother of John, the sons of Zebedee, among the first disciples called by Jesus. Apparently James and John were somewhat hotheaded, for Jesus called them Sons of Thunder. These brothers are twothirds of the inner circle of disciples (Peter being the third one) who witnessed many important events, including the raising of Jairus's daughter and the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountaintop. They also argued with each other who would be next to Jesus in the next life. In the Book of Acts, James' martyrdom is recorded, as the first disciple to die a martyr's death.

According to tradition, James's body was borne to Compestello, Spain, where pilgrimages have taken place for centuries.
