Episcopal Minute: William Wilberforce

William Wilberforce, Feast Day July 30, is described in our saints' book *Lesser Feasts and Fasts as follows:* "The life of William Wilberforce refutes the popular notion that a politician cannot be a saintly Christian, dedicated to the service of humanity."

Wilberforce was already a young member of Parliament when he experienced conversion to an evangelical Christian life. At first he thought that meant he should leave politics, but his friends convinced him that political life needed someone like him to bring the voice of humanity into political considerations. He was elected to the House of Commons in 1780 and served until 1825.

"Above all, his fame rests upon his persistent, uncompromising, and single-minded crusade for the abolition of slavery and slave trade." (LFF, 336) He achieved the abolition of the importation of slaves in 1807 (which also influenced slave trade in the US), but slavery itself continued in Britain (as it did in the US). Wilberforce died on July 29, 1833, just one month before slavery was abolished throughout the British dominions.

Wilberforce is the subject of the inspiring film "Amazing Grace," which also shows his close friendship with John Newton, former slave trader, clergyman and author of the hymn "Amazing Grace."

Wilberforce also had a great love for animals and animal welfare, founding humane societies in England.
