Episcopal Minute: David Pendleton Oakerhater

David Oakerhater was a Cheyenne warrior in Oklahoma, where he led battles in land disputes against the US government in the 1860s. He distinguished himself for bravery and leadership. In 1875, he and 27 other warrior leaders were taken prisoner by the US Army and sent to a military prison in Florida. There a concerned army captain attempted to educate the captives, teaching them English and about Christianity. David was inspired to transform his leadership in war into a ministry of peace.

Under the sponsorship of a Mrs. Pendleton in Cincinnati, David and other prisoners began their study for ministry. At his baptism in 1878, he took the name David Pendleton Oakerhater in honor of his benefactress. He was ordained to the diaconate and returned to Oklahoma where he served as a deacon until 1931.

David is quoted as telling his people: "You all know me. You remember when I led you out to war I went first, and what I told you was true. Now I have been away to the East and I have learned about another captain, the Lord Jesus Christ, and he is my leader. He goes first, and all he tells me is true. I come back to my people to tell you to go with me now in this road, a war that makes all for peace."
