## **Episcopal Minute: Phoebe**

On September 3 we observed the feast day of Phoebe, a saint I didn't know about, and apparently the church has barely recognized. Our saints book says that she was an early church deacon, mentioned in St Paul's letter to the Romans (16:1), and she was possibly the messenger who brought that epistle to the churches. She is commemorated as an example of women serving important roles in the very early church.

Lesser Feasts and Fasts notes, "We may often think that Paul did it all himself, or at least with the help of a few of the more prominent individuals such as Luke. But the brief mention of Phoebe gives us an example of the many women and men whose calling was to work faithfully in the background to ensure that the Gospel would spread throughout the world."
