Episcopal Minute: Day of the Dead

The Mexican observance of the triangulate celebration of Hallowe'en, All Saints, and All Souls is the subject of much fascination for those of us not raised in this culture.

Mexicans traditionally honor their ancestors over these three days, Oct. 31, Nov. 1 and 2. At home, Mexican families build altars displaying photographs of their deceased family members, as well as food, marigold flowers, and items of remembrance. In the cemeteries, Mexicans go in candlelight to the graves of their deceased family members, bringing food and love, to enjoy a meal as a reunited family. The secular celebrations emphasize making friends with death, making fun of death. Play skeletons are shown riding motorcycles or otherwise playing around as if they were still alive. Special food includes sugar skulls – candies, really – in the shape of skulls and decorated colorfully. The celebration is both raucous and spiritually meaningful. It is shown beautifully in the Pixar movie, "Coco."

Our Hallowe'en derives from ancient Celtic tradition, where the idea of spirits of the dead crossing over to the living on October 31 represents a "thin place." This is demonstrated in another movie, "Fantasia" (1940), with the final scenes showing "A Night on Bald Mountain" as a malign satanic figure who summons the dead from their graves; this scene merges with a candlelit procession to Schubert's music for Ave Maria.

Bookshelf: Lake of Sorrows

Erin Hart has written an intriguing novel, <u>Lake of Sorrows</u>, which centers on an Irish bog, centuries old, where archeological digs are taking place in present time, digging up past sacrificial victims and more recent murders. This fascinating story uncovers secrets in the surrounding community, as well as ancient "bog men" who were submerged long ago in the Iron Age. Irish bogs are fields of peat with long history. The story includes lots of history, archeological detail, and modern neuroses. A good read!
