Episcopal Minute: Guadalupe

Today all Latin America and especially Mexico celebrate the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe. According to the very popular story, the Virgin Mary appeared to a peasant named Juan Diego on December 12, 1531 at Guadalupe, Mexico and told him to tell the bishop that he should build a basilica in her honor on the site. Juan told the bishop what Our Lady asked, and he dismissed Juan as uttering a fairy tale. Juan returned to Our Lady, who opened her arms and gave Juan a huge array of roses. The image of the Virgin was imprinted upon his peasant cloak. Juan returned to the bishop, who believed him this time, and a Basilica of the Virgin of Guadalupe was duly constructed on the site. It still contains the cloak of Juan Diego with its precious imprint. Millions of pilgrims go to the site, often bringing armloads of roses. The event precipitated the conversion of Mexico to Christianity within five years.
