#### **Episcopal Minute: Chalk**

The Epiphany is traditionally a time to bless chalk. Yes, chalk, that white stuff that is used on chalk boards, to write things. According to *Lesser Feasts and Fasts*, "It is a practice in some communities to bless chalk on Epiphany so that people may use it to bless their homes. Traditionally, the chalking is done above the lintel" where a date and initials are inscribed, to bless the house. I was not familiar with the chalk habit, but I certainly know about house blessings, which are frequently done in Epiphany season.

What is a house blessing? It involves a liturgy which takes place in a home (often a new home where the family has just moved in). The liturgy includes scripture (especially the Genesis reading about Abraham and Sarah welcoming the three angels, showing hospitality). The officiant goes from room to room, blessing each space to its purpose, and perhaps sprinkling it with water. The service often includes a eucharist and/or reception for all attending.

Have you recently moved? Consider a house blessing! Ask the Bridges family what it is like.
