No Taize Service on Palm and Passion Sunday

Sunday, April 13, is a big morning in our Lenten observance. The service begins in the parlor with the Palm blessing and procession to the nave, and the Passion part of the service focuses on the reading of the Passion according to Saint Luke. Our Passion readers this year are Pete Iole, narrator; Bo Iole, Jesus; and Charlyn Bridges, all other roles. The service is emotional and meaningful.

In light of the energy required in the morning, the Taize team has decided not to hold a Taize service that evening.

Episcopal Minute: More Lent

We reached the half-way point in Lent last Sunday, the fourth Sunday, and marked it with rose-colored hangings. We heard the beautiful parable of the Return of the Prodigal Son and an excellent sermon by Debbie Likins-Fowler. And now, Lent continues.

This Sunday, the fifth Sunday in Lent, offers us a lovely opportunity for table fellowship with a potluck Coffee Hour following the service. It is something of a warm-up for our Maundy Thursday service, when we will gather at 7 pm on April 17, to simulate a gathering of early Christian community, to celebrate an agape meal and engage in an ancient liturgy. This too is a potluck event, inviting Middle Eastern foods such as dried fruit, cheese and wine. A new sign-up sheet will be in the parlor this Sunday.

The big event for Lent is Sunday, April 13, called Palm Sunday and Sunday of the Passion. The service will begin in the parlor, with blessing of the palms and entrance into the sanctuary, enacting the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem. Immediately the mood changes, from triumphal to tragic, as we hear the reading of the Passion narrative according to St Luke. Our readers this year are Pete Iole, narrator; Bo lole, Jesus; and Charlyn Bridges, all other characters. The Passion Reading is always a moving experience and is the focus of the service. I have never felt equal to the task of preaching about this profound event.
