No Taize Service on Palm and Passion Sunday

Sunday, April 13, is a big morning in our Lenten observance. The service begins in the parlor with the Palm blessing and procession to the nave, and the Passion part of the service focuses on the reading of the Passion according to Saint Luke. Our Passion readers this year are Pete Iole, narrator; Bo Iole, Jesus; and Charlyn Bridges, all other roles. The service is emotional and meaningful.

In light of the energy required in the morning, the Taize team has decided not to hold a Taize service that evening. The next Taize service will be Sunday, May 11, at 7 pm.

Episcopal Minute: Holy Week

The holiest week of the church year begins this Sunday with the Blessing of the Palms and the reading of the Passion according to St Luke. These two observances were on separate Sundays before the revisions of the 1979 prayer book. Putting them together on the same Sunday gives us a kind of liturgical whiplash: first the triumphal entrance into Jerusalem with palms waving, and then immediately the story of Jesus' betrayal, trial, death and burial. It is an intensely moving experience.

Thursday evening we will gather at 7 pm downstairs for our Maundy Thursday service, simulating a gathering of an early Christian community, to enjoy an agape meal and an ancient liturgy. Food items to be blessed include challah bread and wine, cheese, olives, dried fruit, and Mideastern specialties. Participants bringing food contributions are asked to arrive by 6:30. Pretending we are meeting in the third century, we will observe two recent martyrs, Cecilia (230) and Agnes (304). At the close, we will go upstairs to the sanctuary and observe the Stripping of the Altar.

On Good Friday, we are invited to return at 11:30 am for **Stations of the Cross**, followed at noon by the **Good Friday liturgy**. Stations moves through 14 steps of Jesus trial, death and burial. The liturgy offers a reading of the Passion according to John, placing of the rugged cross on the altar, and communion from the reserved sacrament.
