Episcopal Minute: Trinity

This Sunday we celebrate the Trinity, a theological concept first defined at the Council of Nicaea in 325 and still enshrined in the Nicene Creed. Traditionally defined as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the Trinity is also understood as Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer. Preachers sometimes struggle with this topic (Ahem!) but I shall do my best to put flesh on the concept in this Sunday's sermon.

The season of Pentecost, six months sometimes called Ordinary Time, begins and ends with theological concepts. This Sunday it is Trinity. The last Sunday of the season is Christ the King Sunday in late November. In between, we will have time to contemplate the teachings of Jesus, mostly through the Gospel of Luke.
