A Journey to Taize

Bo lole, our gentle guide to Taize spirituality, is contemplating a trip to the Taize community in Southern France. She is researching the possibilities now, for a group trip after Easter (April 5) next year.

Bo visited the community several years ago and the spiritual journey made a huge impression on her. She brought this spirituality back to us at New Life in the prayer services she leads every Second Sunday evening.

More details will come soon, since potential participants will want to make long-range plans. Bo anticipates flying to Geneva and taking a train into Southern France, rather than flying by way of Paris.

The following quote from Brother Roger appears at the close of our Taize service:

"From the depths of the human condition, a secret aspiration rises up. Caught in the anonymous rhythms of schedules and timetables, men and women of today are implicitly thirsting for an essential reality, for an inner life. Nothing is more conducive to a communion with the living God than a meditative common prayer with, as its high point, singing that never ends and that continues in the silence of one's heart when one is along again."

Episcopal Minute: The Women

Several interesting feast days appear in late July. Argula von **Grumback**, a 16th century reformer, July 14; Macrina, a fourth century monastic and teacher, July 19; and the first-wave feminists who meet in 1848 in Seneca Falls NY (Elizabeth Cady Stanton, **Amelia Bloomer and Sojourner Truth**), July 20. Two days later, **Saint** Mary Magdalene (first century) has a major feast day on July 22, and on July 29, Mary and Martha of Bethany (friends of Jesus). That last one is personally important to me, as it is the anniversary of my ordination in 1996, and also the anniversary of the ordinations of the Philadelphia Eleven in 1974
