The Episcopal Minute: Saint Bartholomew the Apostle

Saint Bartholomew the Apostle, whose feast day is August 24, has little show in the Gospels. In Matthew, Mark and Luke, he is known only by name in lists of the original 12 apostles, and in John he is sometimes associated with Nathaniel. There are various traditions about him, the most grisly being that he was flayed alive (I hope that didn't really happen). Another tradition says that he traveled to India.

For me the most notorious association with Bartholomew is with his feast day, August 24, when in the year 1572, Catherine de Medici, queen regent of France, reportedly ordered the infamous massacre, in which between 5000 and 10,000 Huguenots (French Protestants) were slaughtered. It is known to history as St. Bartholomew's Day Massacre, and it lasted about a week. The events of 16th century France are dramatic and even operatic, much of it relayed in Verdi's opera *Don Carlo*.
