The Episcopal Minute: Ministry to the Deaf

Wednesday, August 27, was the feast day of Thomas Gallaudet and his protégé Henry Winter Syle. Thomas has been called The Apostle to the Deaf. He was the son of Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet, founder of the West Hartford School for the Deaf, and his wife, Sophia, who was deaf. After graduation from Trinity College in Hartford CT, young Thomas took a teaching position in the New York Institution for Deaf-Mutes. There he married a young deaf woman, Elizabeth Budd.

Ordained an Episcopal priest in 1851, Thomas became Assistant Rector at St Anne's Church, and founded a church, St. Ann's Church for Deaf-Mutes. It was a burgeoning center for ministry to the deaf.

Henry Winter Syle, born in China, lost his hearing as a young child due to scarlet fever. Henry was a brilliant student, educated at Trinity, Cambridge, and Yale. Gallaudet encouraged Henry to pursue ordination to the priesthood. At the time (1876) anyone who was impaired in one of his senses could not be ordained, but Henry became the first deaf person to be ordained in the church, as deacon in 1876 and priest in 1883. In 1888 he built All Souls Church for the Deaf in Philadelphia.

St. Paul's Church in Canton once had an active ministry to the deaf. One of the parishioners was proficient in sign language and signed the entire Sunday service.
