# Wear plaid on Sunday!

#### Advent arrives!

The beautiful season of Advent begins this Sunday with considerable fanfare. November 1 is also the Feast Day of Saint Andrew, patron saint of Scotland, so we will celebrate both the first Sunday of Advent and St. Andrew with Scottish flair. Bagpipes, lots of plaid, and a Scottish coffee hour will usher in the season.

Liturgical changes for Advent include a new Gospel emphasis, as we begin the new year concentrating on the Gospel of Matthew (last year was for St. Luke). Our Advent service music changes to the familiar and melodic works of Franz Schubert for Kyrie, Sanctus and Fraction.

The first three Sundays of Advent will observe saints on (or near) their feast days. St Andrew is first on Nov. 1, Dec. 7 observes St Nicholas (with Joe Bridges preaching); and Dec. 14 we will celebrate St Lucia with Scandinavian flair, including a Santa Lucia procession (Bea Dale, age 5, is studying for her starring role) and a Coffee Hour and Cookie Exchange after the service. The fourth Sunday, Dec. 21, we will hear Troy Dunne as guest preacher, bringing us to the door of Christmas.

# **Episcopal Minute: Thanksgiving**

Various religions have long celebrated agricultural festivals. In America, the observance of a harvest festival of thanksgiving was begun in New England by colonists in Massachusetts and Virginia and extended throughout the United States by an act of the Continental Congress. The celebration was intermittent in the 19<sup>th</sup> century until 1863, when President Abraham Lincoln issued a proclamation that Thanksgiving Day would be on the last Thursday of November. In 1941, following an act of Congress, President Franklin Roosevelt designated Thanksgiving Day on the fourth Thursday of November.

I always heard this change was at the request of merchants who wanted to start Christmas shopping a little earlier. What would they have thought of Black Friday!

I'm sure you know that Thanksgiving Day has nothing to do with Christmas shopping. Here's a good reminder, the prayer from BCP, for Thanksgiving Day:

Almighty and gracious Father, we give you thanks for the fruits of the earth in their season and for the labors of those who harvest them. Make us, we pray, faithful stewards of your great bounty, for the provision of our necessities and the relief of all who are in need, to the glory of your Name; though Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

# Deacon's Dismissal The Rev Josh Butler

In a dusty cardboard box I found my father's old copy of Joseph Conrad's Lord Jim. The book, published in 1906, was held very dear by my father and he passed it on to me. I've read Lord Jim more than once over the years: Jim as a seaman cadet ... Jim's abject failure as first mate on the ship Patna ... then Jim's defeated withdrawal to the isolation of the Malaysian Archipelago. There, Jim hoped for sanctuary ... perhaps relief from his failure ... perhaps even to prove himself worthy. I do not pretend to entirely understand Jim ... though I do see in Jim something of myself.
