Episcopal Minute: The Saints of Advent

We love Advent for all its traditional flourishes, from the Advent wreath with four candles, to the building of the Nativity creche. Several favorite saints are also observed in this season, beginning with St Andrew on Nov. 30.

Dec. 4 was the traditional feast day for Saint Barbara who, alas, was dismissed from the saints' calendar by the Roman Catholics in about 1969. when the Second Vatican Council did some housecleaning, declaring that Barbara (and even Christopher!) had probably never lived. What a shame! Their stories are so wonderful! So, recently, the Episcopal Church added Barbara back into the calendar, now on Nov. 24, with two companions of doubtful historicity: Catherine of Alexandria and Margaret of Antioch. The three have been restored to our observance, not because their stories are literally true, but because they represent the early church's effort to recall the trauma of the early martyrs and admire their braveness and endurance.

Fortunately Saint Nicholas made the cut. His feast day of Dec. 6 has been established from the time he actually lived in the fourth century, although the legends told about him are probably not literally true. Never mind. They are all wonderful, even the ones we tell today in movies such as "Miracle on 34th Street" (1947) and "The Christmas Chronicles (2018). We look forward to Joe Bridges' sermon this Sunday, Dec. 7, about Saint Nicholas.
