Holy and living God, who nurtures our faith: Help us to be so rooted in your love that we may encourage New Life in others.

Episcopal Minute: Light

Light in the darkness: the season of Advent offers this powerful symbol in many ways.

Our Advent wreath offers cumulative light: every week we add to its aura with the addition of another candle, this week three of them. By Christmas Eve, the light of Christ will be fully blazing with four candles plus the Christ candle in the center.

And what is this wreath anyway? I always see it as a symbol of the world, a circle of unending light (an illusion to the poem *The World*, by 17th century metaphysical poet Henry Vaughan): I saw Eternity the other night.

Like a great ring of pure and endless light,

All calm, as it was bright, And round beneath it, Time in hours, days, years Driv'n by the spheres.

One of the most meaningful elements of our Taize services is the use of candles, softly lighting our sacred space. During the meditation time, we are invited to light candles, each representing our prayers, and these prayer candles too have a cumulative effect, ever brighter as more prayers help grow the light.

I hope you have some version of an Advent wreath in your homes, for your private prayer times. It needn't be anything fancy. This year, Norm and I have four pillar candles which we light to usher in each morning. We wait in the darkness as the gentle light invites us to prayer.

Tuesday Group on Family

There was discussion about Family
Reunions, growing up in large vs small
families, and the scattering of recent
generations. There were questions
about starting conversations during
holiday gatherings, how to engage
younger generations, and dealing with
messy family relationships.

Details about 5 family story types were presented and why they matter. The Love Story, or how you met your partner, (Parents, Grandparents); The Resilience Story, or how the family overcame hardship; Values, What beliefs and traditions have guided your family; Your Origin Story, where are you from, what culture or tradition, what events, shaped your families journey; and Identity, what choices shaped you and is there someone who has influenced your personal journey.

Additional discussion guides are in the parlor for any interested, including suggested activities for family gatherings during this holiday season.
