Bishop Anne's visitation to New Life on January 11

The Rt. Rev. Anne B. Jolly will make her official Episcopal visit to New Life on Sunday, January 11.

This is her first visit to us, and we are pleased to welcome her. With 79 parishes in the Diocese of Ohio, and no assisting bishops, Bishop Anne will only visit individual parishes once every three years.

We will provide a coffee hour after the service, when Bishop Anne will make a short presentation. Afterwards, and the vestry (old and new) will meet with the bishop in the library. The bishop will be celebrant and preacher at the service.

Loose offerings (undesignated) will go to the Bishop's Discretionary Fund, for support of clergy, congregations, and non-budgeted ministries.

Episcopal Minute: Holy Name

New Year's Day is also liturgically significant, as The Holy Name of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Formerly entitled The Circumcision, it comes eight days after Christmas. Eight days is the normal day for the circumcision of a Jewish male child and has significance for all observant Jews. At such a ceremony, the child is officially named, and hence our observance, now named Holy Name, is just a title change for the holy day.

Food in January

Our usual schedule for coffee hour (first Sundays) will change in January because of the visitation of Bishop Anne Jolly on **January 11**. Coffee hour will move to that date, overseen by Team 4 but with assistance from others. A sign-up sheet for food offerings is in the parlor.

Next, our Annual Meeting is always accompanied by the Chili Cookoff, an enduring tradition at New Life. The meeting and Cookoff will be held on January 25, overseen by Team One. A signup sheet for chili and other treats will be available in mid-January. The Chili Cookoff will take the place of February's coffee hour, with contributions welcome from everyone.

March 15 is the closest Sunday to St. Patrick's Day (March 17) and we have always shown a fondness for the observance, so the March coffee hour will have an Irish theme on March 15, overseen by Team Two.

The Bookshelf: Tidelands

The prolific novelist Philippa
Gregory is in the midst of a new series,
based on 17th century English history,
with the first two novels available on our
Bookshelf. She is best known for
historical novels detailing English
royalty (especially the Tudors). In this
series, she highlights common folk with
a lot of grit.

Tidelands (2019) tells of a poor family that lives on the coast of England, where the tides render the land either wet or dry, in rotation. The family is used to this daily fluctuation, which is also a metaphor for their lives. The author gives us careful character studies of this family, with the historical background accurately portrayed: The 1640s, the English Civil War, with Oliver Cromwell in charge and the King of England Charles I under duress (and eventually executed, 1649). The second novel, <u>Dark Tides</u> (2020) picks up the family story in 1670, after the Restoration of the monarchy with Charles II. The second novel has a fascinating sequence in Venice, continuing the theme of living on the water. The author is a skillful writer with plot twists galore, keeping the reader captivated. Good reading!
