## Lent is coming!

Lent comes early this year, because of the early Easter on April 5. We will celebrate the end of the Epiphany season on Sunday, February 15, with Scott Bridges preaching on the Transfiguration and the Ioles hosting their famous Mardi Gras breakfast.

Lent officially begins on **Ash Wednesday, February 18, with Holy Eucharist service at 12 noon, including the Imposition of Ashes**

The first Sunday of Lent is February 22, when the 10 am service will begin with the Great Litany, chanted a cappella by Rev. Barbara. She is currently lining up lay preachers for the Sundays of Lent Feb. 22 through March 22. Palm Sunday comes on March 29, beginning with the palm procession and focusing on the reading of the Passion according to St. Matthew. **Valerie Thorson returns as our organist.**

Holy Week services include the traditional Maundy Thursday Agape Feast at 7 pm April 2, Good Friday services of Stations of the Cross at 11:30 am and the Good Friday liturgy at 12 noon.

## **Our Lenten Outreach Project**

Lenten will be here soon, and we always do a project during this reflective time. Too many people are experiencing hunger especially with food cost going up. I would like our members to continue to support FISH by bringing food to the church, but we can also write checks to FISH and to the Akron Canton Food Bank. The purchasing power they have is amazing. ## **The Episcopal Minute: Brigid of Kildare**

During his sermon last Sunday, Troy Dunn mentioned that Sunday, February 1, was the feast day of Brigid of Kildare – that he had to mention that, because he was a loyal son of Ireland! True, true – Brigid is a patron saint of Ireland, and her feast day is February 1. I switched some liturgical observances so that we could have the Presentation (normally February 2) on Sunday, but we fans of Brigid knew it was her day too! Brigid was a fifth-sixth century Irish saint, constantly giving away her family's food and resources to help the poor as a child.

As a young woman, she gathered a group of women around her to guard an ancient sacred flame and founded a monastery in 470 at Kildare. Eventually the monastery also had a section for men too and produced many fine works of illuminated manuscripts. Brigid participated in many councils and synods of the Irish church. She died in 523 and her remains are said to be interred with those of St. Patrick.

**O God, whose servant Brigid,  
kindled with the flame of your love,  
became a shining light in your  
church: Grant that we also may be  
afire with the spirit of love and  
discipline, and walk before you as  
children of light. Amen**

## **Michael Award: The Bridges**

Scott offered his expertise in the technical arena and served as treasurer one year. All three of them are avid lay preachers, bringing us their take on the scriptures for our enlightenment and inspiration.

As a threesome, they have participated in local choir groups, and enhanced the St Timothy's choir for their annual Lessons and Carols for Epiphany service on several occasions. And wow, do they cook! Scott makes a mean chili for our cookoff, and delicious soups on other occasions. Charlyn is the grand champion of Scottish shortbread and all manner of other goodies.

I was especially grateful for their participation in the Natural Church Development Action Team this past year. They made up one-half of the six-member team, analyzing our parish's current invisibility and offering concrete proposals for improvement. All three of them have full-time jobs, but somehow they always were able to show up for our monthly meetings on Thursday afternoons. They are all tireless

promoters of our parish. Scott is the author of the best description of New Life, namely, we are "small but mighty." His metaphor is the Charlie Brown Christmas Tree, a loving and loyal response to our challenges.

Last January they had just moved into their new home, and on New Year's Day I was honored to bless their home. They live in sacred space, at home and here. They are always concerned for our welfare, our stability, and our growth in God. I truly don't know how we could get along without them. Well done, good and faithful servants!
